

busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not airconditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

- 17. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 18. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
- 19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by the permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20. This show will be held under the Rules and Regulations of the Kennel Club.
- 21. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.

Directions to The Newstead Centre (from J27 M1 motorway) See map aside

Follow A608 towards Hucknall. Straight over first roundabout. Straight over second but keep in left lane. At traffic lights turn left onto Derby Road, signposted Sherwood Forest, Kirkby in Ashfield & Mansfield. In about one quarter mile and immediately after 30 mile per hour signs, turn right into Annesley Cutting, signposted Newstead Station.

Follow road through Annesley Village and then in about a mile turn left after sign for Newstead. signposted "School". Turn left again and go past the little children statues at the school.

Follow the road around past the Royal Gurkha on the left until you get to the venue on your right hand side. Go past the venue & turn right and right again immediately before the level crossing into the large car park.

If you go over the railway crossing you have gone too far!

Security at Shows

In light of recent events The Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows.

The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert. Furthermore the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedures in place.

Our Judge Mr Stuart Plane



I handled my first show dog as a teenager in 1968 but it was not until I qualified as a teacher that I was able to have my own dogs. My first Scottie was Desert Border Queen, of Viewpark breeding in 1975 who was the dam of my first Champion Ch Stuane Princess Royale, born in 1978. She in turn produced 4 Champions plus other top winners abroad. To date there have been 25 Stuane Champions plus two Stuane Champion Toy Poodles. I am closely involved with a top kennel of Griffon Bruxellois owned by my partner David Guy.

Notable successes include winning the Group at Crufts in 1982 with Ch Stuane Highland Empress who went on to become the Bitch CC record holder at that time. Ch Stuane Enchanted and Ch Stuane Florette were

both outright winners of the Pup of the Year competition. Ch Sandgregs English Garden at Stuane became the first Wheaten Champion for several years in the UK. English Garden was the start of 6 generation Champion bitches in direct descent, a record for the breed in the UK.

My judging career started in 1978 at local Open Show level leading me to award CCs for the first time at National Terrier in 1984. I have awarded CCs in Scotties many times plus now award CCs across three groups, Terrier, Utility and Toys and am now a Best in Show judge. I am looking forward to judging Best in Show at Crufts in 2022. Judging has taken me to many continents across the world which has given me the opportunity to view how the breed is developing. My next visit to Sweden is something I will treasure as I have judged in Sweden several times and have always admired their top quality dogs.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

The word "dog" includes both sexes

In the following definition, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for members' specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 10 November 2025 Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted.

A Variety Class is one in which more than one Breed or a variety of a breed can compete.

First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).1920.

- (2) Transfer:
- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Baby Puppy - A baby puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

Minor Puppy - For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

Puppy - For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Junior - For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

Post Graduate - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where challenge certificates were offered for the breed.

Limit - For dogs which have not become show Champions under the KC Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the KC, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Open - For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show. Veteran - For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show.

Special Beginners - For owner, handler or exhibit not having won a Challenge Certificate in the breed. Brace - For 2 exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The show will open at 9.30 a.m. N.B. Exhibits will not be admitted to the hall before this time.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.30 am.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- Entry fees;

Members: First Entry (per dog) £12.00. All Subsequent entries (including Brace) £3.00.

Non Members: First Entry (per dog) £15.00. All Subsequent Entries (including Brace) £5.00 Catalogues; Ordered with entries £3.50. For sale on the day £4.00, Ordered in advance, marked and posted £4.50. Rosette donations - £4.00 per class.

- Prize money: Best in Show £50, BOS £20, RBIS £20, BPIB £20, Best Veteran £10, £5 for every 1st prizewinner.
- 7. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under four calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.

10. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show (if scheduled) respectively. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show.

A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Any Variety Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Breed may be declared in each breed from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There must be no progression to further competition

11. Best in Show

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B). Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/ event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
