Sunday 29th March 2026.**

My thanks to the committee for the invitation and to the exhibitors for a respectable entry. Temperaments were good, as were coats, some could have done with a tidy up, but all were of correct texture. I was surprised to find a number of incorrect bites. Exhibitors should check the bites on their dogs on a regular basis, as they can alter as dogs get older. Only one part of the dog, but in a terrier a very important part, in my opinion.

Baby puppy D/B.

1; Percy's Winetta Nordic Union, 5 ½ Month light clear red B. balanced head, with keen expression and strong jaw. Presented a balanced outline. Clean shoulder, firm topline and well set tail. Shown in good condition, moved truly and soundly. Best Baby Puppy.

2; Smith's Cloverbrook Pol Roger of Gethlee, almost 5 month wheaten brindle D. Well grown for age, masculine in outlook with well made head, deep stop and correct bite. Excels in front, with firm topline into well set tail. Good angulations both ends. Moved soundly once he settled.

3. Percy's Winetta Nordic Design.

Veteran D.

1; Parker-Tucker's Ch. Uniquecottage Grey Borage, 7 ½ yr old clear cream D. Masculine in outlook with the best of heads, with deepest of stops, keen expression and correct bite. Balanced outlook, with pronounced forechest, firm topline and well ribbed. Shown in a full coat of correct texture. Moved with purpose. **Best Veteran in Show.**

2. Lamb's Birselow Come Dancing with Macmoon OSW JW ShCEx ShCM, 8 yr old Dark grey brindle. Balanced head with broad skull and muzzle, keen expression. Well made throughout, with a balanced outline and well angulated quarters. Shown in a full coat of good texture. A shade heavy, which was affecting his performance on the day.

Minor puppy D.

1; Parker-Tucker's Uniquecottage Silver Bram, 6 month old clear wheaten. Still very raw, but so much potential. Well developed head for age, with lovely expression and good bite. Excels in front, with firm topline and good quarters. Loved his balanced outline. Moved steadily when he settled.

2; Griffiths' Wonderpaws Darth Vader, 8 month old grey brindle. Nice make and shape, with firm topline and well set tail. Shown in excellent coat and condition, accomplished showman. Preferred head and expression of class winner.

Puppy D. No entries.

Junior D.

1; Hogarty's Cadagio That's What I Like NAF, almost 12 month bright red. Very impressed with this young male. Presented a balanced outline with correct angulations both ends. Totally masculine in outlook, with a well made head with a keen expression, good bite with big teeth. Shown in good coat and condition. Well muscled and moved soundly. Pleased to award him the **CC.**

Yearling D.

1; Percy's Ariom Northern Dancer with Winetta, 20 month clear red. Nicely balanced head, broad skull and muzzle with good bite and big teeth. Well made in front with excellent forechest. Good overall balance with firm topline, well ribbed and well made quarters. Shown in excellent coat and condition and an accomplished showman. **RCC.**

Postgraduate D.

1; Robertson's Cornton Summer Special. Wheaten with well made head, deep stop and good bite. Well balanced with good front and firm topline, into well set tail. Covered the ground well, a shade close behind.

2; Polanek's Birselow Morris Dancer. Clear wheaten, with a masculine head and expression. Good length of neck into well made front, firm topline and tailset. In excellent coat, a shade heavy on the day. Moved steadily.

3. Kears' Lindcoly Outta This World.

Limit D.

1; Griffiths' Wonderpaws Obi Wan Kenobi. Wheaten who presents a smart outline. Well made head with deep stop and excellent bite. Well angulated front, with firm topline and well ribbed. Shown in good coat and condition, a confident showman.

2; Munday's Furythor Reluctant Villian. Dark brindle well balanced head with strong jaw. Presents a smart outline, well angulated front and rear. In good coat and condition. Moved okay and showed steadily.

3; Saich's Lindcoly Golden Buick.

Open D.

1; Munday's Lentrica Mystic Warrior. Dark brindle. Masculine in outlook, well made head with good bite. Presents a balanced outline, with good front and forechest. Firm topline and excellent quarters. Coat of good texture but needs a bit of a tidy up.

2; Lucas & Torbutt's Seveek Country Lad. Grey brindle, another masculine dog with a well made head, with a good bite and keen expression. Shown in excellent coat and condition, well muscled and moved soundly. Just preferred the overall balance of winner.

Veteran B.

1; Smith's Cannwood Misty Dawn at Gethlee. Clear wheaten with a balanced head, deep stop and good bite. Not overdone in any way, excels in front, with firm topline into well set tail. Shown in excellent coat and condition. Belies her age with her enthusiasm.

Minor Puppy B.

1; Parker-Tucker's Uniquecottage Red Ayla, Clear red with beautifully balanced head, deep stop, and such an intense expression, excellent bite with big teeth. So well balanced, excels in front with pronounced forechest, firm topline and good quarters. In good coat and condition. Showed steadily and moved soundly. One to watch. Pleased to award her **Best Puppy in Breed**.

2; Saich's Lindcoly Nessa Shanessa. Dark brindle with a broad skull and muzzle, deep stop and good bite. Good in front, with good spring of rib, well made quarters. Moved and showed steadily, shown in a full coat. Not quite the overall balance of class winner.

3; Saich's Lindcoly Beautiful Zuri.

Puppy B.

1; Saich's Lindcoly Esmeralda. Dark red brindle with broad head and good bite. Excels in front, with good shoulders and well ribbed.. Shown in a very full coat which spoilt her outline a bit. Unsettled on the move which spoilt her topline.

Junior B.

1; Shannon & Storr's Brenndarcy Dreamer. Clear red. Well balanced head, with good width of skull and muzzle, and good bite with large teeth. Presents a balanced profile, with firm topline, kept on the move, well set tail and good quarters. In a full coat of correct texture, moved steadily when settled. A shade heavy.

Yearling B.

1; Parker-Tucker's Uniquedottage Sorrel. Clear wheaten. Very feminine in outlook, beautifully balanced head, with deep stop and good bite. Excels in front with shoulders and forechest, firm topline and excellent quarters. Shows steadily. Considered for top honours.

2; Hogarty's Ir Ch Cadagio Mad About You. Feminine light red brindle. Well balanced head, with good expression and correct bite. Good in front and firm topline, well set tail. Excellent showgirl, in good coat and condition. Just preferred the overall balance of class winner.

3; Shannon & Storr's Brenndarcy Supertramp.

Postgraduate B.

1; Percy's Ariom Calypso Dancer with Winetta. Ultra feminine clear red. Beautifully balanced head with the deepest of stops, intense expression and correct bite. Good length of neck into well placed shoulder and upper arm and good forechest. Firm topline, held on the move, tail set right and well muscled quarters, with short hocks. Presented to perfection. Confident showgirl who moved soundly and covered the ground well. Well deserved **CC & BIS**.

2; Clarke's Furythor Born To Sparkle by Lentrica. Feminine dark brindle, with well made head, deep stop and correct bite. Balanced outline, with well made front, firm topline and good tailset. Shown in good coat, a shade heavy. Still moved well and covered the ground.

Limit B.

1; Griffiths' You're So Bossy Seglavi with Wonderpaws (Imp Pol). Up to size clear bright red. Beautiful head with deep stop and intense expression. Presents a balanced outline, very good in front, firm topline, well ribbed and firm quarters. Shown in excellent coat and condition. Consummate showgirl, who moved steadily.

2; Saich's Lindcoly Let It Be Me. Feminine grey brindle. Balanced throughout, with a good front and forechest, firm topline and well made behind. In a good jacket, slightly heavy but didn't affect her movement.

3; Smith's Cloverbrook Shining Star Over Gethlee.

Open B.

1; Felters & Rumens' Ch Landbuck Amethyst. Light brindle, totally feminine in outlook. Excels in head, with intense expression and good bite. Presents a balanced outline. Good front with a decent amount

of forechest, firmest of topline and a well set tail. Shown in excellent coat and condition, moved steadily, **RCC**.

2; Saich's Lindcoly Picture Perfect. Light grey brindle, another nice bitch. Balanced head, with broad skull and muzzle. Presents a balanced outline, good in front, firm topline and well ribbed. Shown in good coat and condition. Shows well, not quite as positive behind as class winner

3; Saich's Lindcoly Ocean Dream.
